Scottish Ballet presents a fascinating programme of pure dance influenced by the grace of geometry, neo-classical chic and contemporary classical music, two of which have never been performed in Aberdeen before and the third, Fearful Symmetries, is back by popular demand!

Bodytext

Bodytext is a performance work which uses speech, movement and the body, to question and offer insight into the relations between movement, agency, representation and language.

Using real-time motion capture, voice recognition and interpretive language systems, the dancer's movement and speech are acquired and remediated within the performance space. The dancer's acquired speech is re-written within a projected digital display, the text animated by and re-presenting the performer's gestures. The performer can, through their movements, cause texts to interact and recombine with one another, changing their grammatical composition in the projection.

The work is an evolution of the company's award winning Enclosure 44 - Humans, (Herald Angel, Total Theatre short-list) which was performed inside an animal enclosure at the Edinburah Zoo during the 2008 Fringe. The ANa Project is loosely based on two separate events which took place in Australia between 1990 and 2005.

Director/Choreographer Ian Spink and Composer/Sound Artist Bill Thompson will explore through sound, movement and visual elements, the very separate journeys of two Australians - one a native artist, travelling south by air 'over his mother's country', embarking on his first commission for a leading art gallery in Melbourne, the other a German immigrant, former air-hostess, caught up in the throes of extreme personal change, hitchiking from Melbourne, to an unknown destination in the northern most part of Queensland.

The planned piece consists of a series of sung, spoken, danced episodes based on a 1500 mile 'journey' straddling the tropic of Capricorn, ranging between the extremes of the Australian far Northern Territory and the 'sophisticated' southern capital city Melbourne. Time, landscape and history are not as simple as they seem.

As well as raising questions of how we can know or re-invent ourselves or the 'landscape' of our surroundings, ANa will seek to probe new relationships between sound, image and action in performance.

This piece marks the second collaboration between Ian Spink and Bill Thompson.
